<b>Main Question</b>	A key question is formed from the information in the key ideas.	An important question is formed.	A question is formed that can be answered by the information.	A question is formed that cannot be answered by the information.
<b>Evidence for Answer</b>	Evidence that answers the question is listed in chronological or logical order.	Evidence is listed that answers the question.	Evidence is listed that answers the question.	The evidence does not answer the question.
<b>Illustrations</b>	Simple coloured illustrations support the key ideas and evidence.	Coloured illustrations support the evidence and ideas.	Black and white illustrations support the evidence.	Illustrations do not clearly support the evidence.
<b>Connection</b>	A paragraph of 5-7 sentences clearly explains a significant connection to history or present-day life. A set of sentences explains a connection to the student's personal life or a movie.
<b>Conventions</b>	There are very few spelling, grammar, punctuation mistakes, and word spacing is accurate. Includes a cover page with name, number and date.
